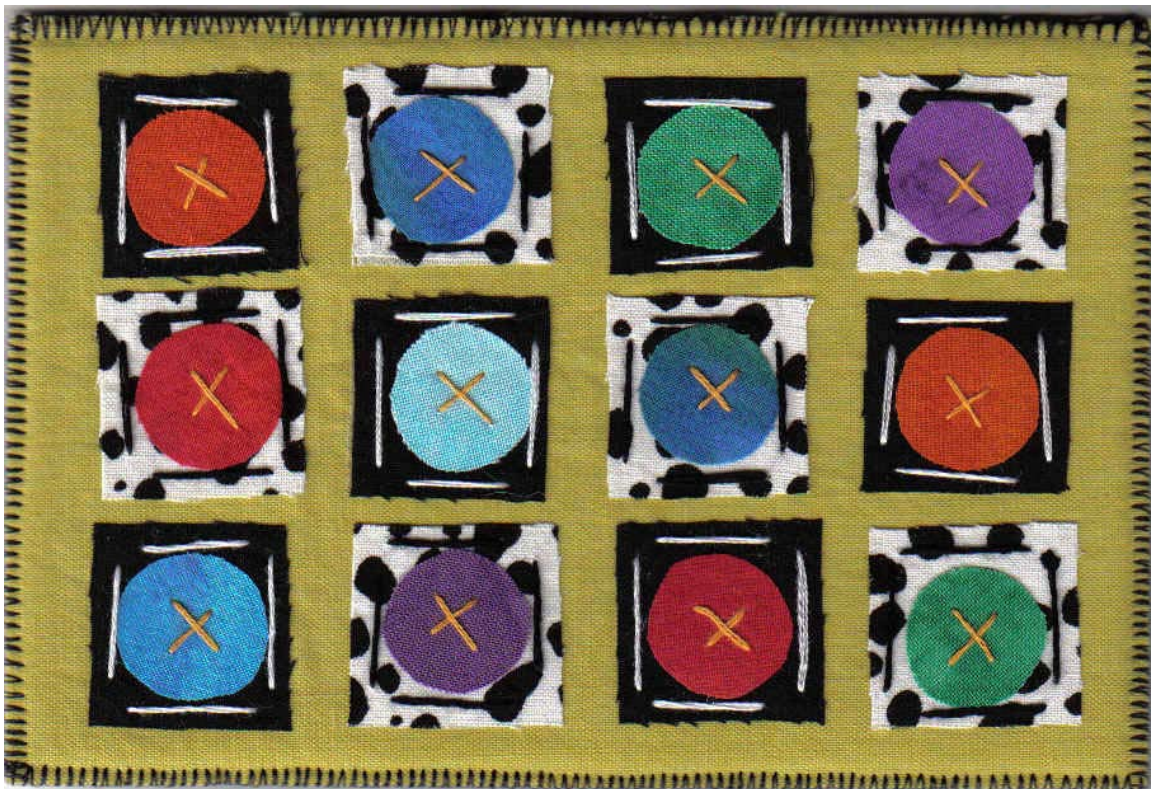

Dots and Spots Fabric Postcard Pattern

To Create the Dots and Spots Fabric Postcard:

1. Adhere fusible web to the back of your chosen fabrics according to your package directions. Cut out the fabric pieces in the following sizes. I free cut mine to give them some irregularity!
 - A. CUT 6: Piece A, 1" W x 1" H, Black and White Print Fabric
 - B. CUT 6: Piece B, 1" W x 1" H, Black Solid Color Fabric
 - C. CUT 12: Piece C, Circle the size of a penny or dime, Several Colors of Solid/Hand-Dyed Fabrics
 - D. CUT 1: Piece D, 6" W x 4" H, Solid Color Background Fabric
2. Place the background fabric (Piece D) on the Peltex and fuse it in place.
3. Place the squares in 3 rows of 4 squares, alternating black fabrics (Piece B) with black and white print fabrics (Piece A.) See the photo for placement. Just be sure to leave yourself at least ¼" free edge around the postcard so you can finish the edges when you're done. Fuse the squares in place.
4. Place a circle (Piece C) in the center of each square. Fuse the circles in place.
5. Hand or machine stitch the "X" motif in the center of each circle and side lines on each 4 sides of the squares. I used 3 strands of orange embroidery floss for the "X" and hand stitched them. For the side lines of the squares, I used 3 strands of white embroidery floss on the black squares and 3 strands of black embroidery floss on the black and white print squares and hand stitched them.
6. Trim the edges back to your 4" x 6" postcard size with your rotary cutter.
7. Continue to quilt the postcard as desired, either by hand or machine. Embellish, attach the back, finish the edges and go!
